

- Colleges have said that as long as the school provides the policy they've used to
 - Calculate grades in the 3rd and 4th quarters
 - Assist students in deciding to opt for P/F v. Letter Grades
 - Calculate GPA
 - Determine class rankings
- ...that students will not be penalized for their choices or the policies
- Colleges are also thinking about using 1st O Senior year grades in their evaluations


Changes: Standardized Testing

- The College Board (SAT, SAT Subject Tests)
 - Conducted AP Tests remotely → sued due to issues, unequal access
 - Has been canceling in person dates due to testing sites being closed
 - Announced in June 2020 that they will be unable to provide remote SAT/SAT Subject Test sittings due to equity issues
- ACT
 - Same challenges as the SAT
 - Has canceled plans (this year) to offer re-testing of specific areas
- In response, hundreds of schools have gone 'test optional' or have stopped requiring the test for admission
 - Some state school systems require the test per law
 - Some schools still require test scores for merit scholarships
 - Top 50 schools have been slower to declare themselves "test optional"



Good news and bad news

Changes: Coronavirus Experience Essay



- Common Application
 - Providing an optional essay prompt inviting students to talk about their experiences and challenges during the pandemic
- Coalition Application
 - Providing a series of questions (checkboxes) that students can answer that describe their experience during the pandemic
- Both applications are providing space for counselors to identify the challenges their schools and student have undergone during the pandemic

Changes: Summer Experiences

- Coronavirus has fundamentally altered the summer experience
 - Summer Jobs
 - Available in some areas
 - High risk areas (grocery, restaurants, etc.)
 - Volunteering
 - Remote opportunities are available, but may not lend the same experience
 - No longer able to volunteer in high risk areas (hospitals, nursing homes, hospice care, etc.)
 - New opportunities as a result of COVID-19 have become available
 - Summer Classes / Enrichment Programs
 - Have moved online
 - While the knowledge gained might be similar, the experience is decidedly different



Changes: College Touring



- College Tours have moved online
 - Check admissions websites for
 - Virtual admissions sessions (live and recorded)
 - Virtual tours
 - Admissions blogs insights into admissions officer's thinking and institutional priorities
 - Sign up for information
 - Some are coming back in person but very socially distance
- Print and Social Media
 - YouTube channels have more content
 - FB, Instagram, Twitter
 - Campus Newspapers
- Books
 - Fiske's Guide to Colleges
 - Princeton Guide

Changes: Financial Aid

- The FAFSA relies on the 'prior prior' year for calculating your estimated family contribution (EFC)
- Families that have experienced a material change in circumstances THIS year and that have NOT recovered should contact each school's financial aid office prior to completing the FAFSA / CSS Profile for guidance
- Always ask the admissions or financial aid office how outside scholarships impact financial aid
